Cover Image: The bronze head of Sir Robert Garran was originally commissioned by the "Convocation" of the (then) Canberra University College. When it was completed, however, they thought it was not a sufficiently good likeness and refused to accept it or pay. Some time later, the staff of the College, who knew of the bronze head but did not agree with the earlier assessment, decided to buy it themselves as a gesture to Sir Robert and present it to the College. At that time (1952) Sir Robert was Chairman of the Council of the Canberra University College, and Professor Pentony was Chairman of the College Staff Association. The bronze head was duly presented by Professor Pentony on behalf of the University Council. John Fleming, later the first Sir Robert Garran Professor of Law, said he would be pleased to display the head in the (then) Department of Law, and there it has remained.
