Has taught at the Universities of Paris, Istanbul, and Dakar, and at Chicago, Harvard, Miami, Michigan, and Stetson. Has been a member of the teaching staff at American law programs in Salzburg, Beijing, Paris, Rhodes, Leyden, and Amsterdam. From 1970 to 1980, served as U.S. representative and in other capacities with the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law; represented the United States at diplomatic conferences on international agency (Bucharest and Geneva) and international sales (Vienna); from 1979 to 1998, served as member of the Governing Council of the International Institute for the Unification of Private Law in Rome and is a member of its Working Group on UNIDROIT Principles of International Commercial Contracts; served as a member of the U.S. Secretary of State's Advisory Committee on Private International Law. Reporter for Restatement (Second) of Contracts. Publications include a multivolume treatise on contracts, also in a best-selling one-volume student edition, as well as Contract Law in the USSR and the United States (with Mozolin, 1987); Cases and Materials on Negotiable Instruments (1993); Cases and Materials on Commercial Law (with Honnold, Harris, Mooney and Reitz, 1993); An Introduction to the Legal System of the United States (1996; available in ten languages); Changing Your Mind: The Law of Regretted Decisions (1998); United States Contract Law (1999); and Cases and Materials on Contracts (with Young and Sanger, 2001).
