Robert McCorquodale will discuss state responsibility for extra-territorial violations of human rights by corporate nationals. He will do so by considering in what circumstances a state is responsible under international human rights law for its transnational corporations which violate human rights when operating outside its territory.

Robert McCorquodale is Professor of International Law and Human Rights at the University of Nottingham and is also the Head of School. He was Associate Professor in International and Human Rights Law at the ANU from 1995-2000, and a Fellow and Lecturer in Law at St. John's College, University of Cambridge from 1988. Prior to this he was a solicitor with large law firms in Sydney and London.
