Catherine has more than 10 years experience in anti-doping internationally, including working at the Senior Executive Service level with the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority. As one of the legal representatives to the Australian Olympic Committee in the lead up to the Sydney Olympic Games, Catherine established strong relationships with National Sports Organisations and International Federations.

This work involved drafting the anti-doping policies for the 32 Olympic sports, as well as conducting more than 30 anti-doping prosecutions. Catherine won the 2003 World Anti-Doping Agency Legal Paper Prize for: "Legal Requirements for Blood Testing – Oceania".

Catherine's anti-doping consultancy clients are based in the UK, Sweden, Canada, Brazil and Qatar. Catherine is a member of the SportAccord (GAISF), IBAF (baseball) and ICC (cricket) anti-

doping tribunals. Catherine's interest is in inter-agency collaboration between anti-doping organisations and law enforcement agencies. Catherine has been a WADA Independent Observer (Pan-American Games, 2007) and a WADA Outreach team member (Commonwealth Games, 2002).
