

## ANU-Alabama Joint Summer Program 2012

### General information

Ten ANU undergraduate law students will be given the opportunity to travel to Alabama for a five week program. The program is scheduled to run from Saturday, 7 January 2012 to Tuesday 14 February 2012 inclusive.

### The Program

A semi-intensive comparative environmental law course will be taught by **an ANU staff member** and a University of Alabama staff member, Associate Professor **Heather Elliot**. Another semi-intensive course introducing various aspects of US Law, such as Constitutional Law, US Courts, Criminal Law and Administrative Law will be taught by the Alabama Law Faculty.

The program will also include several fieldtrips.

### A few good reasons to participate in the program:

- On successful completion of the assessment, credit will be given towards your degree (two 6-point Law electives), with tuition fees payable as part of your HECS schedule.
- You are not required to travel as a group to the USA, so you can combine your educational expedition (experience?) with an American adventure!
- Subsidised student accommodation in Alabama.
- Experience American culture and hospitality!

### Accommodation and Expenses:

In addition to HECS/FEE-HELP/course liability for **two** 6-unit law courses:

- (1) ANU administrative fee: A\$1,500
- (2) 5 weeks accommodation in Tuscaloosa (to be paid to ANU): A\$1,500
- (3) 5 weeks living expenses in Tuscaloosa: budget for at least A\$150 /week (approx A\$750 overall)
- (4) AIRFARES—depending on departure location, date & type of ticket (current estimates A\$3,500 (**ex Sydney**) including airport taxes (estimated)

**TOTAL ESTIMATED STUDENT COST FOR 5 WEEKS FOR ANU STUDENTS (not including HECS (x 2 subjects)): A\$7,300 approx**

(Please note that costs are an estimate only and do not include any car hire for weekend excursions)

### Selection Criteria:

1. Priority will be given to later year students (students who have less than 12 semester length courses left to complete by the end of the current academic year).
2. Where necessary, academic merit and chronology (the order in which applications are received) will be taken into account in selecting applicants.
3. The Program is only open to ANU Law Students.
