Rodney Croome is a spokesperson for the Tasmanian Gay and Lesbian Rights Group, a former Co-convenor of the Australian Council for Lesbian and Gay Rights and in June was made a Member of the Order of Australia for his contribution to the gay and lesbian human rights movement.

Earlier this year the UN Human Rights Commission failed to support the first ever resolution on sexuality discrimination to come before it. Australia only agreed to support the resolution after concerted domestic lobbying. In this seminar, Rodney Croome will talk about the history and the future of UN and Australian responses to the challenge of global sexuality discrimination and persecution.
