Don Rothwell is the current President of the Australian and New Zealand Society of International Law (ANZSIL). His major research interest is international law, with a specific focus on law of the sea and law of the polar regions. In this seminar he will speak on the legal aspects of the Antarctic Treaty System, especially law of the sea and the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD).

Alan Hemmings is the Chair of the International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Antarctic Advisory Committee; the Regional Vice Chair (Antarctica) for the World Commission on Protected Areas; and Senior Adviser for the Antarctic and Southern Ocean Coalition (ASOC). He has just returned from the Antarctic Treaty Consultative Meeting (ATCM) in Madrid and he will speak on developments relating to bioprospecting discussed at the meeting and on various national Antarctic bioprospecting initiatives.
