Judge Diarmuid O'Scannlain, is a Senior United States Circuit Judge on the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals, which covers approximately ten western states in the United States. His professional interests include judicial administration and reform and continuing legal education, and he has participated in over 4,000 federal cases and written hundreds of published opinions on such subjects as constitutional, securities, administrative and criminal law.

Prior to his appointment to the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals, Judge O'Scannlain held the positions of Deputy Attorney General of Oregon, Public Utility Commissioner of Oregon, and Director of the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality.

In this seminar Judge O' Scannlain, as a long time observer of the U.S. Supreme Court and Judiciary, will give an insider's view on the recent Supreme Court ruling.
