### ANU Law Student selected for ICJ traineeship

The ANU College of Law congratulates Jennifer Cavenagh as the chosen recipient of the prestigious and highly competitive award of the International Court of Justice traineeship program.

Jennifer graduated from ANU with a BA(Hons)/LLB in 2007 while participating in the 'Distinguished Scholar Program' in European Studies. During her law degree, Jennifer focussed on International and Constitutional Law, receiving a Deans Prize for Law and Society and South-East Asia while undertaking an internship in the International Law Section of the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade.

Jennifer also participated in the Welfare Rights and Legal Centre Clinical Program, providing advice on welfare and tenancy issues.

Jennifer completed her Graduate Diploma of Legal Practice in early 2008 and participated in the National Europe Centre European Studies Summer School in December 2008, focussing on law and human rights. She completed the French Government's Diplôme approfondi de langue française C1 (a diploma of proficiency in French) in the same year, building on her studies in France. Finally, Jennifer commenced her Master of Laws specialising in International Law at the ANU earlier this year.
