# Governance and Power-Sharing in Cyprus: Facilitating preliminary peace talks

In a seminar presented by the Centre for International and Public Law, Dr Jeremy Farrall reflected on his experience as a UN Facilitator during the preliminary phase of the current Cyprus peace process.

The ANU College of Law hosted the seminar which was conducted under [Chatham House Rules](#).

In 2008 Jeremy facilitated the discussions of the Working Group on Governance and Power-sharing, in which constitutional experts from both the Greek Cypriot and the Turkish Cypriot communities discussed the key constitutional elements of a peace plan, including the likely shape of a Federal Constitution and the Executive, Legislative and Judiciary.

Jeremy is a Fellow at the [Centre for International Governance and Justice](#) in the School of Regulation, Justice and Diplomacy at The Australian National University. He is currently working on the Australian Research Council funded project, [Building Democracy and Justice after Conflict](#).
