Internship Opportunities with the Legal Office of the World Food Programme

The World Food Programme (WFP) is the world's largest humanitarian organization and the United Nations frontline agency in the fight against global hunger (for further information: www.wfp.org).

Reporting directly to the Executive Director, WFP Legal Office is charged with providing solution-oriented, timely and high-quality legal advice to the Secretariat and the Executive Board of WFP. To that end, the work of the Legal Office includes: ensuring compliance of proposed WFP activities with the internal law of the organization, as well as applicable international law and contractual obligations; ensuring that WFP's rights and assets are protected by appropriate legal safeguards; and representing WFP in litigation and dispute resolution. This work is carried out by a multi-cultural team of attorneys and staff with diverse educational and professional backgrounds.

The Legal Office is providing an opportunity for eligible law students to undertake an internship at WFP Headquarters in Rome, Italy. The Office is divided among three branches: Administrative & Employment Law; Contractual & Constitutional Law; Maritime, Transport & Insurance Law. Depending upon the needs of the Organization and the interests of the applicants, Legal Interns will work closely with attorneys in one or more of these branches. The minimum duration of an internship is two months, which may be extended depending on students' availability.

Particular Requirements

Education: Law student with proven interest in international law.

Language:

- Essential: working knowledge (proficiency) of English;
- Desirable: intermediate knowledge of another official WFP language, i.e., Arabic, French, Portuguese, Spanish, Chinese, Russian.
