Cameron has undertaken research on sham contracting in the modern economy, and is currently undertaking a PhD considering the topic of employee competition.



Peta Spender is a Fellow of the Australian Academy of Law. She is a Presidential Member of the ACT Civil and Administrative Tribunal and was formerly appointed to the ACT Courts Joint Rules Advisory Committee. Her research interests include corporations and financial markets law and litigation. She has published widely, is a co-author of leading Australian books on litigation and corporate Law, and has made submissions to various law reform bodies including the James Hardie Special Commission of Inquiry.



Sally Wheeler has been Dean since January 2018, and was formerly a Professor and Pro-Vice Chancellor for Research and Enterprise at Queen's University Belfast. Professor Wheeler has given major addresses and led workshops around the world, and been cited in Australian media as 'one of the world's leading experts' on the governance of pensions. Her research interests include socio-legal studies, corporate law, and contract law.
